Election 2023 Voter Information Guide

Thank you for making a plan to cast your ballot in 2023. Every Vote Counts.

1. First, register to vote or check your registration AND Plan to
2. Vote absentee-by-mail OR
3. Vote early in-person absentee by visiting City Hall OR
4. Vote at a polling place on Election Day, 2/21/23 and 4/4/23

What do I need to vote?

Am I registered to vote? Are my address and name up to date?

1. Go to myvote.wi.gov
 2. Click on "register to vote"
 3. Enter your first name, last name, and date of birth
 4. Follow the instructions to register
 5. If you moved or changed your name, you'll need to re-register. You can do that at myvote.wi.gov
- You can register or re-register:
 - online until 2/1/23 and 3/13/23
 - in-person at the Clerk's office at City Hall, 100 N. Jefferson Street
 - in-person on Election Day at your polling location

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How do I vote absentee by mail?

Follow the steps below to request, complete, and return your absentee ballot.

1. Request your absentee ballot

- Request an absentee ballot by going to myvote.wi.gov
- Click on "vote absentee"
- Enter your first name, last name and date of birth, and follow the instructions.
- You may need to provide a picture of your photo ID. Easily upload a picture when you request online or include a photocopy if you're requesting by mail.
- We recommend you request your ballot by 2/1/23 and 3/10/23.

2. Complete your Ballot

- When you receive your ballot in the mail, open the outer envelope
- Enclosed, you will find instructions to fill out an absentee ballot, a return envelope, and your ballot
- Use a black ball point pen to fill out your ballot
- Place the ballot inside the return envelope

- Sign the return envelope and get a witness to sign their name and write their address on the return envelope (see image below for an example)
- Postage is paid on the inner envelope (the absentee ballot certificate)

Stat. § 6.87(5), if I requested assistance, could know how I voted. I further certify I requested this ballot.

5 Mail back your ballot. Allow 4-5 days for delivery to ensure your ballot is received by Election Day. Ballots received after Election Day will NOT be counted.			

3. Return and Track your ballot

How do I vote in-person absentee at City Hall?

- Voting early in-person absentee is as simple as 1-2-3!

- You may register in advance or register when you arrive at the Clerk’s office. See above for “First—what do I need to vote?”
1. Come to City Hall (100 N. Jefferson) during the operating hours listed [here https://greenbaywi.gov/655/Voters](https://greenbaywi.gov/655/Voters)
 2. Bring your photo ID

How do I vote in-person on Election Day 2/21/23 and 4/4/23?

1. First, check your polling location by going to myvote.wi.gov
 - Click on “Find my polling place”
 - Enter your street address, unit/apt number (if applicable), city and zip
2. Bring your photo ID
3. If you aren’t registered, you can register and vote at your polling [location https://myvote.wi.gov/en-US/FindMyPollingPlace](https://myvote.wi.gov/en-US/FindMyPollingPlace) on Election Day
4. Polls are open 7 am to 8 pm.

Voting absentee is as simple as 1-2-3!

1. Request an absentee ballot at MyVote.WI.Gov

2. Complete the ballot



Open the ballot and read the instructions



Sign the envelope



Get a witness to sign the envelope and provide an address (picture)

3. Return the absentee ballot
